DSA815 Maintenance Mode

Re. Full System Information, 10 MHz Clock Cal

- 1) Maintenance Mode: press (in sequence)
 - > Trace/P/F > TG > Marker Fctn > Meas Setup
 - > System > Print Setup > Storage > Meas Setup > Meas Setup

There should be an indication of entering into "Maintenance mode": Welcome to Maintenance Mode.

Go to either Step 2a (System Info) or, Step 2b (Cal Mode for 10 MHz Cal)

- 2a) Full System Information: press > System > Down Arrow (Lower Right-Side of LCD) > Information > System Info
- 2b) Calibration Menu (10 MHz Cal): press > System > Down Arrow (Lower Right-Side of LCD) > Service > Calibration



DSA815 10 MHz Frequency Standard Calibration Procedure:

- 1) If you are going to make adjustments to the DSA 815's Frequency Standard, warm-up the instruments (DSA815 and Frequency Counter) to the manufacturers specifications (typically a minimum of 30 minutes).
- 2) Connect the DSA815 '10 MHz OUT' to a high accuracy Frequency Counter, such as a accuracy of 1 part in 10 -7 or better. The Frequency Counter will be used to monitor and adjust the output frequency of the DSA815's 10 MHz Clock (Frequency Standard).
- 6) Record the Ref DAC value, so if needed you can return to the original setting.
- 4) Adjust the Ref DAC value in medium increments (100 counts or so initially) while monitoring the Frequency Counter.
- 5) Adjust the Ref DAC value for 10.000,000 MHz as close as is reasonably possible (e.g. within \pm a few Hz). 10 Hz = 1.0 ppm, 1 Hz = 0.1 ppm

Exit 'Maintenace Mode' and return to the normal User Mode:

1) **User Mode:** press (in sequence)

2) There should be an indication of entering into "User Mode":

Welcome to User Mode.

Note: Rebooting (Power OFF/ON) the DSA815 also restores the User Mode.
